ACADEMIC SESSIONS: The full academic year is comprised of two terms, each with 13 weeks of classes and an examination period. Each class meets for 3 hours a week. Full-year courses have a credit value of 6; one-term courses have a credit value of 3. The spring and summer sessions are approximately 6 weeks in duration with 65 hours of class time for a 6-credit course and 32 hours for a 3-credit course.

CREDITS: Brackets around the credit value indicates that the student did not receive credit for the course or that the course is in progress. Prior to 2003-2004, a minimum average of 55 was required for credit to be earned in undergraduate courses with grades of 50-54. See note for (50-69) A.

GRADES: Courses are graded numerically except for a few pass/fail courses. The passing grade is 50 for undergraduate programs and 60 for graduate programs. An approximate conversion to letter grades for undergraduate and graduate level programs is: A = 99-80, B = 79-70, C = 69-60, D = 59-50, F = less than 50. For the Ph.D. program, the conversion to letter grades is A + = 94-100, A = 87-93, A - = 80-86, B + = 77-79, B = 73-76, B - = 80-86

ACADEMIC INTEGRITY: Offences pursuant to the StFX Academic Integrity Policy may result in reduced grades or, in some instances, suspension or dismissal. Notations will appear in the applicable academic session and may be permanent or removed on a specific date or upon graduation.

NON-ACADEMIC MISCONDUCT: In cases of suspension or dismissal, a notation will appear on the transcript.

ACADEMIC STANDING: A student is in good academic standing unless otherwise noted. An average of 55 (60 for Bachelor of Education, 70 for graduate level programs) must be maintained in undergraduate programs to avoid academic penalties. Academic penalties are assessed at the end of the full academic year only and are applied after the subsequent spring session. Students who require fewer than 30 credits to complete their degree will not be subject to academic penalties. Suspensions are for 10 months and encompass one summer session and one full academic year. Dismissals are permanent. Students may appeal suspensions and dismissals.

AVERAGE: Averages are weighted by the credit value of each StFX course. Averages are not calculated for part-time students or for those who withdraw during an academic year.

DECILE: Student's ranking (10 high, 1 low) in a course (minimum of 15 registrants in the course)

DROP DATE: Date student dropped a course

RANK: Student's rank in his/her degree program and year of study. Rank is not recorded for students registered in fewer than 24 credits or students who withdraw during an academic year or for some specific programs.

TRANSFER CREDITS: Courses for which transfer credits are awarded are given as equivalent StFX courses where applicable. Otherwise, electives are awarded in specific subjects with course numbers that normally reflect the level of the course and the credit value associated with it. For example, a 200-level, 3-credit History elective may be displayed as HIST 293. Transcripts prior to 1999 may read 993, 996 or 999 for elective credits.
